Friday, December 2nd and Saturday, December 3rd are CIWW's biggest days of the year as we come together and pack up toys that will be delivered to children in Central Indiana over the holidays. Jacque Beck reports that in 2022, our members created **over 10,775 toys and gifts for kids** which will be distributed with the help of 41 community-based agencies.



As usual, this is an 'all hands on deck' event for our members to come and help us make a difference in Central Indiana. Here is how you can help:

On **Friday, December 2nd**, we need a dozen or so members who can help load up boxes of toys from storage and set them up at the venue in preparation for Saturday's event. Mike Robards is the

coordinator for this part of the process, so if you have questions, give him a call...he'd love to have some help from our strong-backed members! His number is (**317**) **416-9755**.

On Saturday, December 3rd, starting at 8:30 AM, donuts and coffee will be served for all volunteers. Then, at 9:00 AM, we start packing. We should finish by 12:00 PM, at which time there will be pizza and drinks served to all volunteers.

The venue for Saturday's packing will be at **Talon Test Laboratories**, **915 Western Dr**, **Indianapolis**, **IN 46241**. Everything will be

Directions: Talon is located just west of I-465 on the west side of Indianapolis. You can get to it from either US 36 or Washington Street. **From US 36,** go South on Girls School Rd. Turn left (East) onto W. McCarty St. You will see the sign for Talon Test Laboratories at the bend in the road on your left. **From West Washington St.** Exit from I-465, go west on Washington St. and go to High School Rd. Turn right, go north to W. Morris Street, and turn left. Go until you see Western Dr and turn right. You will see Talon Labs at the bend in the road on the right.







Delivery drivers should park on the north side of the building (driveway on left), and other volunteers should park on the south side of the building (driveway on the right.)





Toy of the Month

For those who want to work on creating something for our **Toy of the Month** program for next year, we are offering one item to keep you occupied during the holiday break. The primary Toy of the Month we're promoting is a simple **Passive Speaker Box** for a cell phone. This unique design, by **Mike Penna**, uses 1/4" hardwood to make a simple box, with a hole to hold the phone and amplify the audio. The hole can be made to custom fit specific phone types. **Plans will be available at the December meeting** and no extra parts are needed.

An alternative **Toy of the Month** for the holidays would be any of the animals from previous years which can be found on the <u>Make Sawdust</u> page on the website. Review the animals listed, download the plans, and reuse any of the templates you already have in your shop. Mike Robards will have a collection of assorted parts available at the back table during the December meeting.

The turners will be set up for their annual Christmas open turning event. There will be several lathes available for members to use to practice turning skills.
